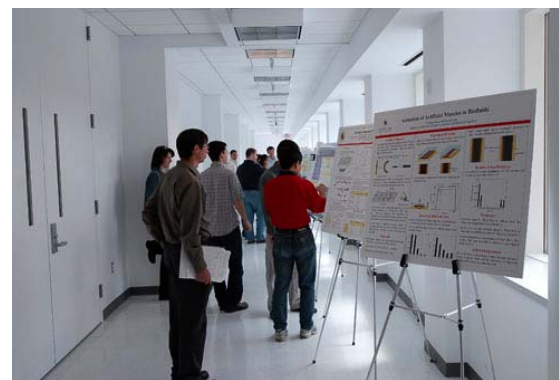
INVITATION

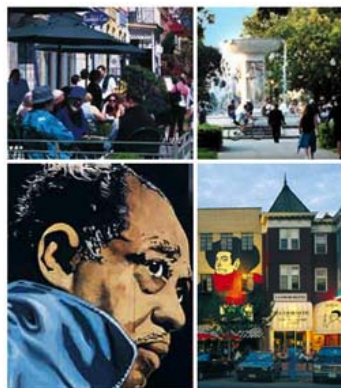
